

O Who is FOL?

Friends of LACES is the parent group for LACES. FOL works with Principal Boger, teachers, staff and fellow parents to support the LACES students. Ø Fundraisers & Donations

Parents donate in the fall to the Annual Giving Campaign (*AGC*). This is the largest fundraiser for FOL. *Spring Gala* is in March/April. Parents are asked to donate items for the drawings/silent auction, attend & bid. *LACES Big Eat-* Two family dinner nights a year.
