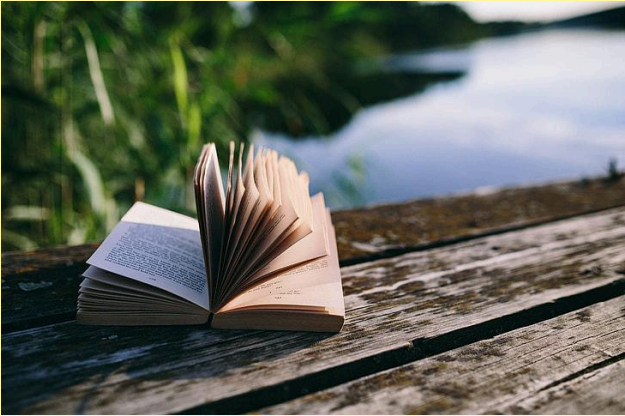


# LACES 2025-2026
